- Complete a self-reflection about their accomplishments and challenges during the school year.

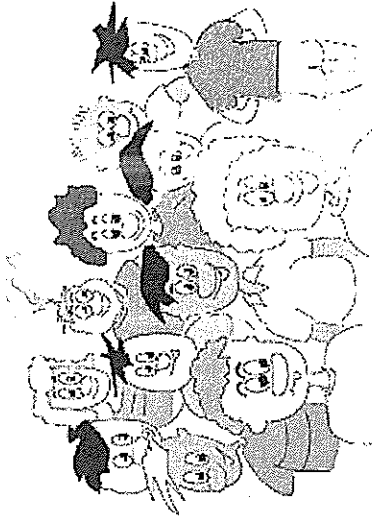

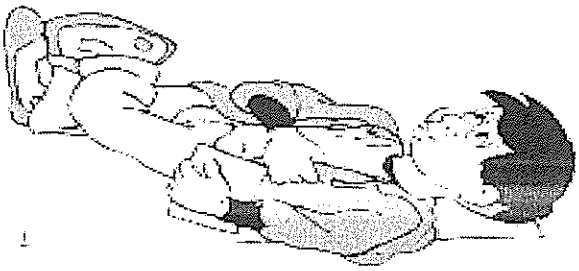

What is an ILP?

⊕ An Individual Learning Plan (ILP) is a process for setting goals, making a plan to achieve them, and evaluating student progress.

⊕ An ILP helps students to be successful in school and plan for middle school

An ILP is Required

⊕ The Rhode Island Board of Regents and the Department of Elementary and Secondary Education believe that learning how to plan is important to student future success.

⊕ It is mandated that all Rhode Island students in grades 6-12 have an Individual Learning Plan (ILP).
